Don't miss the deadline...
March 1

Awards range from \$1,000 to **\$16,000.**

If you are planning to attend a **four-year college**, apply for the **Thomas E. Reynolds Scholarship (TER)**. You will also be automatically considered for the EEF Undergraduate scholarship. If you are going to Gateway for an associate degree or certification, apply for the **Thomas E. Reynolds Jr. Gateway Technical College Scholarship**.

Both require a short, online application. Here's how to apply...

To get ready, you will need to upload these documents, so gather electronic copies of...

- your transcript (an informal one is just fine) and
- two letters of recommendation (1 personal and 1 from school).
- (You may include your general scholarship application, but it is not required.)

Preparing to complete your application...

- Go to eefscholars.org or use the QR code.
- Go to the Scholarships tab and find the Scholarship Page for the appropriate scholarship. Go to LEARN MORE for the TER or Technical College Scholarship. On the scholarship page, tap on the "Apply" button.
- Browse the application to see what information and attachments are required.
- Look at the requirements for the 2 written reflections. We recommend typing and saving these in Word or Google docs. Check the word counts, spelling, and grammar. (See "Notes on reflections" below.)



Completing your application...

- Type in all required information (contact info, college applications, etc). There are blue asterisks on required responses.
- Paste in (or just type in) your reflections.
- Attach your personal and academic letters of recommendation and your high school transcript. (You may also attach your general scholarship application, but it is not required.)
- Make sure that all the fields are complete and **MAKE SURE TO TAP "Submit."**

Notes on reflections

- Look at the word counts. These are short! A 500-word reflection is about one page, single-spaced.
- For the reflection on your college and career plans, make sure to help your readers understand how your college program will prepare you for your plans toward an environmentally focused career.
- For the reflection on an experience you have had, write about a specific thing you did (volunteer, school, club, project... or a job, or hobby) and explain how this activity reflects your commitment to protecting and/or better understanding our environment.
- If you are citing information in your reflections, you may formally cite the source, but an informal citation is also OK – such as *"According to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources..."*
